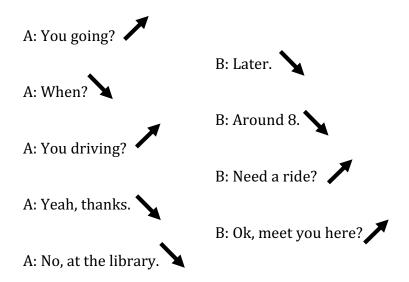
Respond to their rejoinder in <u>any appropriate way</u> using a short sentence if you can.
